# COMMANDER'S REPORT

Welcome to Spring!

The past couple weeks have been really nice and the boating opportunities have been outstanding. If you've been out on a weekend, you know that a lot of folks have been waiting for the nice weather. The slow zone around marker 96 resembles

I-75 in downtown Atlanta at rush hour. The different boats you see are pretty awesome. I know a lot of these boaters probably struggled with that age old question: Do I get four motors or five?

We got a chance to window shop as Curt Collins coordinated a tour of Nor-Tech on March 27<sup>th</sup>. It was a great tour and many of us saw how these local boats are manufactured. I don't envision us getting a future factory discount, but who knows? The building continues to be on the market. Our agent did conduct an open house a few weeks ago and there was some interest, but nothing concrete. One of the things they did a nice job of was illustrating the possibilities for different types of businesses or groups. As we all know, our location is a major selling point, especially with all the activity around us.

The docks are now open at the new Bimini Basin Seafood and Cocktails restaurant. I know that many have already tried it out. They have some really nice floating docks, in addition to many fixed docks. It's a nice spot if you want to enjoy a leisurely canal cruise. It's the same ownership as the Deep Lagoon near Marine Max and there are many similarities. It's been packed on weekends, so plan accordingly.

A couple of us will be attending the District 22 Council and Commander's meeting this coming Saturday. This meeting is in Sarasota and is a good opportunity for all the district squadrons to share information and concerns. We've got a pretty good list, mostly of the latter. A big concern is that we have many members who are not getting their renewal notices from national. We've had to follow up on quite a few of these. The fact that national

dues will be increasing is also a concern and we lack the specifics of this transition.

We are in the process of receiving a big donation of used boating equipment from a Sanibel-Captiva squadron member. This gentleman contacted us, as he has retired from boating and wants us to help him downsize. He's already donated quite a bit to Sanibel but they aren't able to take any more. They don't have a building or storage space. Once we get things finalized we'll need to sort through everything and then decide how to proceed.

There's quite a bit of activity at the Yacht Club. All the docks and 95% of the pilings are gone. A couple days ago they started inserting new seawall panels. These are big, roughly 45 feet tall. They use a track hoe with a special attachment to pound them into the seabed. It's like a giant jackhammer. It's noisy and you can feel the vibration a long way off. I included a photo. At long last we are finally seeing some progress.

# SQUADRON EDUCATION OFFICER (SEO)

## What do you really know, and why you should care!

Your vessel's marine VHF radio is the second most important piece of safety equipment aboard. Knowing how to properly operate it could mean the difference between life and death, literally! Maybe you do, maybe you don't. During an emergency is not the best time to find out, especially when time is of the essence!

Or maybe you're one of those boaters that don't have a radio aboard, but, rather, rely on your cell phone should the need arise. After all, who leaves port without their phone? If that's you, you are taking an unnecessary risk with the safety of your vessel, your crew, and yourself. Sure, 911 is always an option if you're close enough to shore, but it can delay the arrival of first responders while the 911 operator properly routes your call.

Knowing how to properly use a marine VHF radio while out cruising is like having extra insurance. You're not likely to use it, but, if the need arises, it's great to have. Should you want to know more, the Cape Coral Sail and Power Squadron will be offering its two-hour seminar on how to get the most from your marine VHF radio. Or, if you don't have one, how to go about selecting one to fit your space and your wallet. Come join us for this informative talk. Space is limited, so sign-up as soon as possible. And, do you trust your local weather forecast? Do so, at your peril. These are notoriously inaccurate. Sometimes the local weather forecast doesn't give the full picture when out on the water. The Weather for Boaters seminar shows you how to forecast short time changes in weather, without the need of any fancy equipment, that can adversely affect your time on the water, regardless if time of year. Indeed, sometimes it's best to stay in home port, and go out some other day. May brings the all-important Hurricane Preparation seminar, date tentatively scheduled for May 12. Get valuable tips and techniques on how to properly safe your vessel so it survives the storm with minimal damage.

Seminar offerings for April and May, are:

1. Local Waters Seminar, April 14: there's still room, so if you're new to the area, or need a refresher, this is the place to be to gain insight into our local estuary system;
2. Using Marine VHF Radio, April 14: learn or take a refresher on how to properly use the second most important piece of safety equipment on a vessel.
3. Weather for Boaters, April 21: forecast short term weather without special equipment so you'll reduce risk of getting caught in a storm while cruising;
4. Hurricane Preparation, May 12: get all important information on how to properly secure your vessel for tropical weather systems and have it survive.

Finally, if there is a course or seminar that you'd like to take which is not on the schedule, let me know and I'll do my best to accommodate you.

# The Southwest Florida Boating Seminar

New boaters arrive in Cape Coral every day, most with no idea what they are about to encounter on our waters. Mike Carter moved to the Cape with years of fishing experience and now spends as much time as he can finding new spots on the water to try. Besides covering places to go, the seminar also helps new residents understand how our local waters have been impacted by needs to support commercial development in Fort Myers and the efforts to drain the Everglades beginning in the late 1880’s.

The *Southwest Florida Boating* seminar is based on the books by fellow member Tom Dawson, *Barret Bonden’s Local Knowledge* and *Safe Boating in Southwest Florida, Your Guide to the Many Channels on our Waterways*. These books and local charts will be available for sale at the seminar. These items make great welcome gifts for your new neighbors.

If you are looking for a way to introduce your new neighbors to our club, invite them to attend the seminar. It is being held on Tuesday April 14<sup>th</sup>. The session runs 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. 

## Co-Op Charting Update

I am happy to announce that we have started AToN Verification Survey Runs in March. We do have new Guidelines to follow for AToN Runs this year. The loss of insurance for the operation remains. Co-Op Charting activities are a volunteer activity for all participants and is a “go at your own risk” activity. The main change is that the run is now a Boat Captain organized run instead of a Run Coordinator organized activity. The Captain picks/invites the crew members for the run. The Group Chair can assist the Captain with requesting volunteers if needed. There are some other minor changes you will notice. One of which is that there is no longer a Navigator crew position on the run. The crew is made up of the Captain and Trained Observers with one of the Observers filling the role of a Recorder.

We did complete one AToN Run on March 24 with Tom DeMarzo volunteering as Captain with a crew for Route E (Shell Point to San Carlos Bay). The next run is currently scheduled for March 28 with Pete Hohmann volunteering as Captain with a crew for Route J (Sword Point, Cape Coral to Matlacha Pass Bridge). Following is a run scheduled for April 10 with Phil Botana volunteering as Captain with a crew for Route A (Royal Palm Yacht Club, Ft. Myers to Franklin Lock). You will see more run opportunities available for April and May soon.





## National Recreational Boating Safety Survey

The Coast Guard is pleased to announce the start of the National Recreational Boating Safety Survey (NRBSS), a nationwide effort commissioned by the U.S. Coast Guard's National Recreational Boating Safety Program. This survey is the only comprehensive source of recreational boating data across all 50 states and the District of Columbia and plays a critical role in informing safety and security initiatives on our waterways.

The survey targets boat owners, individuals who rent or borrow boats, and members of the paddle craft community (kayaks, canoes, and stand-up paddleboards).

# Blueberry Barbecue Grilled Chicken

-Chef Craig Buechler

- 2 tablespoons chili powder
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1 whole cut-up chicken
- 1 medium yellow onion
- 6 cloves garlic
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 cups of fresh blueberries
- 1 cup barbecue sauce (I use Sweet Baby Rays)

1. Make dry rub. (Combine chili powder, brown sugar, Italian seasoning, salt, and red pepper; stir to blend, then divide in half). Place chicken in large bowl and coat with one-half spice mixture, rubbing mixture into chicken pieces (wash hands). Chill for 1 hour (or overnight).

2. Chop onion and garlic finely. Preheat medium saucepan on medium 1–2 minutes. Place oil in pan, then add onions and garlic; cook 4–5 minutes until browned. Preheat grill (or grill pan) on medium.

3. Stir blueberries and remaining-half spice mixture into pan; cook 3–4 minutes until berries begin to break down. Pour in barbecue sauce and reduce heat to low; simmer 6–8 minutes, stirring often, until sauce is

thick and glossy. Cover and remove pan from heat.

4. Place chicken on grill; cook 18–20 minutes, turning often, until grill-marked and 165°F, brushing with blueberry barbecue sauce during last few minutes of grill time. 


